1. This Act may be cited as the Diplomatic Immunities (Representatives of Overseas Countries) Act. **Short title.**

2. (1) Subject to the provisions of section 3, any person named by the Governor-General by notice in the Gazette as being a person duly appointed to represent the interests of an overseas country in the West Indies shall have and enjoy in Antigua and Barbuda all the privileges, immunities, exemptions and other benefits that are for the time being had and enjoyed by the Ambassador of a foreign country accredited to the Court of St. James in the United Kingdom. **Designated representatives of overseas countries to enjoy diplomatic immunities.**

**CAP. 136) *Diplomatic Immunities (Representatives
of Overseas Countries)***

(2) The Governor-General may from time to time cancel or amend, as the necessity arises, any notice given under subsection (1).

Expiry of Act.

3. The Governor-General may, by notice in the *Gazette*, declare that the need for the special provisions of this Act no longer exists and from the date of such notice this Act shall cease to have effect.
