1. This Act may be cited as the Wakes Act.

Short title.

2. If any wake or gathering of persons in respect of any deceased person be continued after the hour of eleven ing wakes after o'clock at night accompanied by any singing or noise, the eleven o'clock. occupant or person in charge of the house or room in which such wake or gathering may be held and the persons conducting such wake or gathering shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars:

Provided that no person shall be convicted of an offence under this section unless the Magistrate is satisfied that some person has been disturbed by the singing or noise.

wakes are held.

any person remaining immediately outside such house or room, after being so requested to depart by such police officer, shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars.
