AN ACT to provide for the amendment of the Proceeds of Crime Act 1993, No. 13 of 1993 to reform the provisions in relation to restraining orders and for related matters.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Antigua and Barbuda as follows—

1. Short title

This Act may be cited as The Proceeds of Crime (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 2017

2. Amendment of section 40 of the Proceeds of Crime Act, 1993

Section 40 of the Proceeds of Crime Act 1993, No. 13 of 1993 is repealed in its entirety and replaced with the following —

“40. Expiry of restraining order

Where a restraining order has been made in relation to property, the restraining order shall continue in force until —

- (a) it is discharged by the court; or
- (b) the defendant is acquitted”
