APPROPRIATION ACT 2019

No. 1 of 2019

AN ACT to provide for the services of Antigua and Barbuda for the year ending on the 31st day of December, 2019

ENACTED by the Parliament of Antigua and Barbuda as follows:

1. Short title and commencement

This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act, 2019 and shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 2019.

2. Issue of eight hundred and fifty-six million, seven hundred and fifty-two thousand and eighty-five dollars (\$856,752,085)

The issue from the Consolidated Fund of the sum of eight hundred and fifty-six million, seven hundred and fifty-two thousand and eighty-five dollars (\$856,752,085) is authorized in order to meet

expenditure for the services of Antigua and Barbuda in respect of calendar year ending on the thirty-first day of December, 2019, under the Heads of Expenditure specified in the Schedule; and the sum specified in the Schedule opposite a numbered and named Head is appropriated out of the sum of eight hundred and fifty-six million, seven hundred and fifty-two thousand and eighty-five dollars (\$856,752,085) for the purpose specified in relation to that numbered and named Head in the Estimates for the year 2019.

3. Payment out of Consolidated Fund

The Accountant General is authorized and required, from time to time upon the order or warrant of the Minister of Finance, to pay the sums appropriated in the Schedule to the several services and purposes mentioned as the order or warrant directs out of the Consolidated Fund without further order or formality
