**THE WORK PERMIT (FEES) ORDER, DATED THE 25th DAY OF
NOVEMBER, 1980 MADE UNDER SECTION F 10 OF THE
ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA LABOUR CODE.**

- 1. CITATION.** This Order may be cited as the Work Permit (Fees) Order.
 - 2. FEES FOR WORK PERMITS.** A person within any of the categories of persons mentioned in the Schedule to this Order shall pay into the Treasury for every work permit granted to that person the fee specified in the Schedule opposite to that category.

THE MINIMUM (BASIC WAGE) ORDER

ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA LABOUR CODE

THE MINIMUM (BASIC WAGE) ORDER, DATED THE 18th DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1981 MADE UNDER SECTION C 22 OF THE ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA LABOUR CODE.

Whereas by section C 22 of the Antigua and Barbuda Labour Code it is enacted that whenever the Minister deems it necessary to take steps to regulate the wages paid in any occupation he shall appoint a Minimum Wage Advisory Committee to investigate the conditions of work in such occupation and to make recommendations as to the minimum basic wage which should be payable therefor:

And Whereas the Minister has appointed such Committee and the said Committee has made recommendations to the Minister and the Minister has given full considerations to the recommendations of the said Committee:

Now therefore, it is hereby ordered as follows—

1. CITATION. This Order may be cited as the Minimum (Basic Wage) Order.

2. MINIMUM OF BASIC WAGE. The wages set out in the Schedule hereto shall be the basic wage payable for each such occupation and each level within such occupation.

ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA LABOUR CODE

ANTIGUA AND BARBUDA LABOUR CODE (EXEMPTION OF AIR
TRANSPORT INDUSTRY) ORDER, MADE BY THE
MINISTER UNDER SECTION C 14 (2) OF THE ANTIGUA AND
BARBUDA LABOUR CODE.

1. SHORT TITLE. This Order may be cited as the Antigua and Barbuda Labour Code (Exemption of Air Transport Industry) Order.

2. EXEMPTION OF AIR TRANSPORT INDUSTRY. The provisions of section C 14 (1) of the Antigua and Barbuda Labour Code, shall not apply to airline pilots, stewardesses and the management staff employed in Antigua and Barbuda in the air transport industry.

3. WAGES PAYABLE. All airline pilots, stewardesses and the management staff employed in Antigua and Barbuda in the air transport industry who are required to work on a public holiday shall be paid the normal rate of pay.
